

### THIRD GENERATION.

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39. Capt. WILLIAM RAWSON<sup>3</sup> [12] (William<sup>2</sup>, Edward<sup>1</sup>), was born in Braintree, Dec. 2, 1682, and was a graduate of H. C. in 1703. He m. Sarah Crosby of Billerica, in 1710, and settled in Mendon. Was chosen Selectman March 11, 1729; also chosen by the Selectmen to keep school for three months, beginning with the 8th day of Dec., the same year, and to be paid at the rate of 45 pounds per annum. March 1, 1731, chosen Town Clerk, which office he held for some years. On the 29th of November chosen to keep a *Grammar School* for three months—no doubt the first school of that grade opened in Mendon. He must have been successful, for again, in April, 1737, he was engaged to keep a Grammar School ten months. He took a very active part in town matters, and was a very popular man in his day. He d. 48. DAVID RAWSON<sup>3</sup> [13] (William<sup>2</sup>, Edward<sup>1</sup>), was born Dec. 13, 1683, and m. Mary Gulliver, daughter of Capt. John Gulliver of Milton. His will is recorded in the Suffolk records, Liber 46. He lived on the farm which was occupied by William, his father, near the Neponset Bridge in Quincy, and left to his heirs a valuable estate. He was a persevering business man, and distinguished for energy of character. He d. in Braintree, now Quincy, April 20, 1752. His wife survived him, and her will is recorded in the records of Suffolk, vol. 51. Her personal property was valued at £212 12s. 4d. He was buried at Quincy, and the

following inscription may be found on his grave-stone, a few yards from the family tomb of the late Ex-President, J. Q. Adams:—

“Here lies y<sup>e</sup> body of Mr. David Rawson, who departed this Life, April y<sup>e</sup> 20, 1752, in the 69th yeare of his age.”

107. MARY RAWSON<sup>3</sup> [34] (Grindal<sup>2</sup>, Edward<sup>1</sup>), b. June 22, 1699; d. April 9, 1776; m. the Rev. Joseph Dorr,\* April 9, 1724. He was born about 1690, in Roxbury, Mass; grad. at Harvard College in 1711, and took the degree of Master of Arts in course; was ordained in charge of the First Church in Mendon on the 25th day of February, 1716, and so continued until his death, which occurred on the 9th of March, 1768, in the 79th year of his age, having been in the ministerial charge of this parish more than 52 years. He was the first Moderator of the Mendon Association, formed in 1751, which, for the first five years held its meetings at his house. He continued to be its standing Moderator until his death.

He favored the views of Jonathan Edwards, and signed a testimonial in favor of the "revival of 1740."

The following epitaph upon his gravestone, in Mendon, indicates the estimate placed upon his character by his surviving parishioners:—

This stone is sacred to the memory of the Rev<sup>d</sup>. Joseph Dorr, late Pastor of y<sup>e</sup> 1st Church of Christ in Mendon. He died March 9th, 1768, in the 79th year of his age & 52nd of his ministry. He was indued with good Sense. His Temper was mild & placid. He excelled in y<sup>e</sup> Virtues of meekness, patience, temperance, sobriety, gravity, benevolence & charity—was a good Scholar, a learned Divine and exemplary Christian.

The following inscription is on the gravestone of his wife:—

In memory of Mrs. Mary Dorr, Relict of Rev<sup>d</sup>. Joseph Dorr, who died April y<sup>e</sup> 9th, 1776, in the 77th year of her age. Dust thou art and unto dust shalt thou return.

\* The father of the Rev. Joseph Dorr was Edward Dorr of Roxbury, Mass., the emigrant ancestor of this family. When the Colony of Massachusetts Bay organized the county of Devon at Penaquid, near the mouth of the Kennebec in Maine, Edward Dorr was there, and with other inhabitants took the oath of fidelity on the 22d July, 1674. [See Colonial Records, vol. 5, p. 17-19.] He subsequently removed to Roxbury; perhaps on account of King Philip's war, which broke out in 1675, placing that remote settlement in great peril.

He married 1st, Elizabeth Hawley, who was the mother of all his children. She was the daughter of Thomas Hawley of Roxbury, who was slain by the Indians at Sudbury, April 21, 1676. Mrs. Hawley was the widow of Thomas Lamb, and her maiden name was Elizabeth Harbottle. He married 2d, Elizabeth, the widow of Ebenezer Clapp of Milton, who predeceased him.

Mr. Dorr became prominent in the civil and ecclesiastical affairs of Roxbury. He was one of the selectmen, and held other offices of importance and trust. He died in 1734, leaving a good estate. He was interred in the old burial ground in Roxbury, and his tombstone and that of his wife are [1874] in perfect preservation. The inscriptions upon them are as follows:—

Here lies buried ye body of Mr. Edward Dorr. He died February 9 the, 1733-4, in ye 86 th year of his age.

126. GRINDAL RAWSON<sup>3</sup> [37] (Grindal<sup>2</sup>, Edward<sup>1</sup>), was born Sept. 6, 1707. June 17, 1729, the Selectmen of the town of Mendon agreed with Mr. Grindal Rawson to keep school for the town one month. “The time to commence the 18th inst., to the termination of one month from that time; and what time the said schoolmaster shall be absent said month He to make up such lost time afterwards, and the schoolmaster to be allowed and paid by the town for said services, after the rate of forty five pounds per annum.” Aug. 8th, of that year, the agreement was renewed for one month. April 6, 1730, he was chosen to keep school for one year, and to be paid at the same rate for his services. He, no doubt, taught the first public school in Mendon, and was the first of her sons to graduate at H. C., in 1728; m. May 19, 1738, Dorothy Chauncy, daughter of the Rev. Isaac Chauncy, D. D., of Boston, who was grandson to Rev. Charles Chauncy, the second President of Harvard College. He was the first settled

minister in South Hadley, where he remained about nine years, resigning in 1741. He removed to East Haddam, Conn., and was there settled for life. He d. March 27, 1777, a. 70. His widow d. 1780, a. 70. They had the following children:—
